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K-2, K-8 resurfacing is set in Barber County

Resurfacing will begin soon on K-2 and K-8 in Barber County.

The Kansas Department of Transportation project involves a mill and hot-mix-asphalt overlay on K-2 from the U.S. 281 junction to the Barber/Harper county line. The project also includes K-8 from the Oklahoma state line to the K-2 junction. The total length is 17.5 miles.

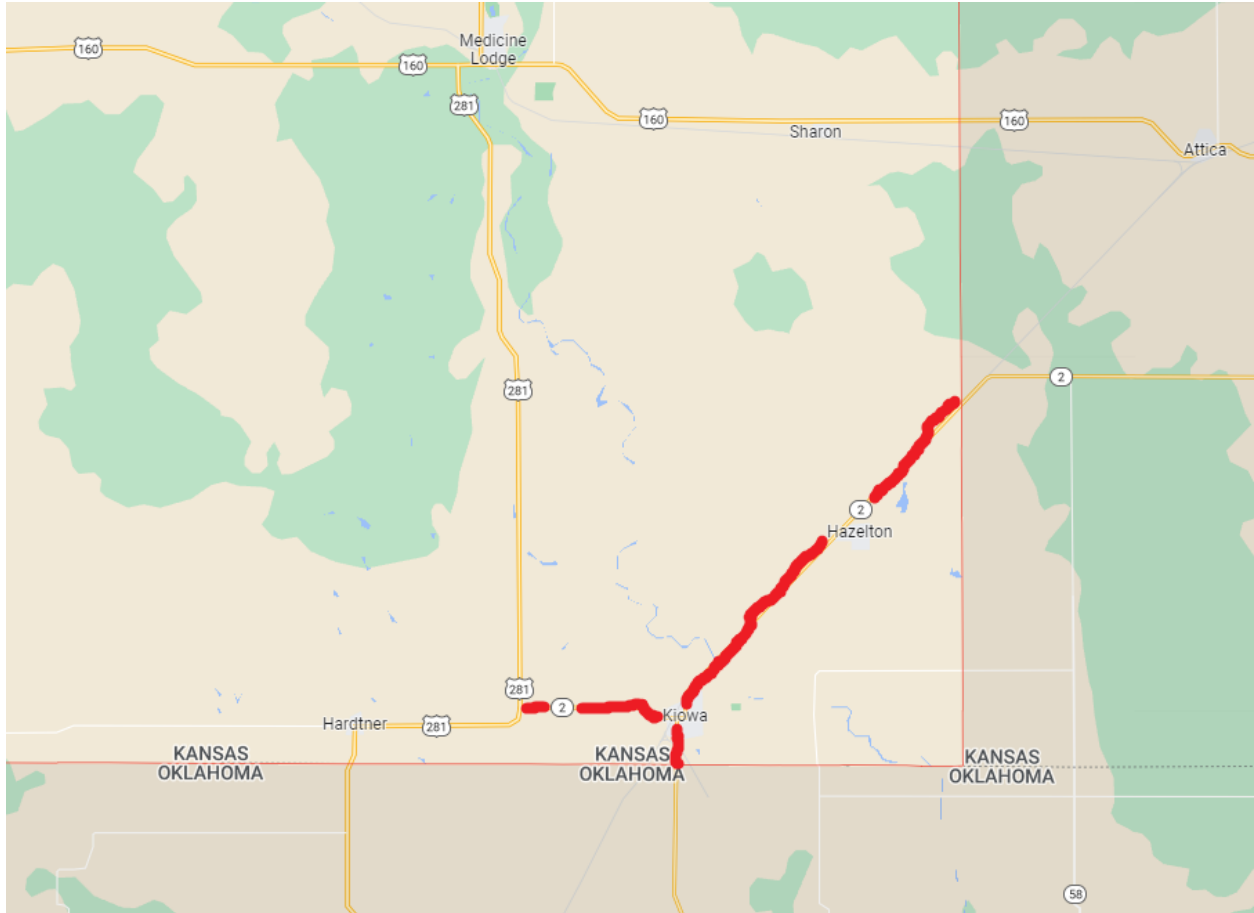
The work is expected to begin around Sept. 19 and be completed around Oct 26.

During the work, traffic will be controlled by flaggers and a pilot car. Motorists should be prepared to slow down and stop and face delays of up to 15 minutes.

Cornejo & Sons, of Wichita, is the primary contractor for the \$3,390,836 project.
