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U.S. 400 concrete patching in Greenwood County begins June 11

Monday, June 11, weather permitting, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) plans to start a concrete pavement patching project on U.S. 400 in Greenwood County. The road work begins at the east junction of U.S. 400/K-99 and continues east for 15 miles to end at the Greenwood-Wilson county line.

Activity includes patching small areas of full-depth concrete pavement, and the removal and replacement of pavement markings. Traffic will be reduced to one lane controlled by signals and a pilot car during daylight hours. At night the signals will be turned off and the highway reopened to unrestricted traffic. KDOT expects the project to be completed by late September, weather permitting.

KDOT awarded the \$2 million construction contract to Iowa Civil Contracting, Inc., of Victor, Iowa. KDOT reminds drivers to obey the signs and signals, and to slow down in the work zone.
