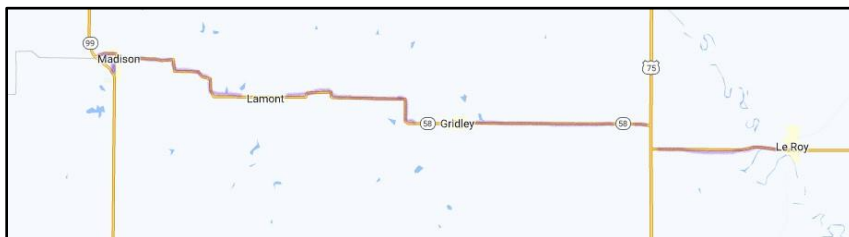
K-58 resurfacing project set to begin in May

The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) plans to begin resurfacing K-58 in Greenwood and Coffey counties the week of May 8. The 32-mile surface recycle project, followed by a chip seal, runs east from K-99 to the north junction of U.S. 75 and then continues east from the south U.S. 75 junction to end at LeRoy. The project also includes a surface recycle and chip seal on K-249 at Madison.

Flaggers and a pilot car will direct one-lane traffic through the work zone. Expect delays of 15 minutes or less during daylight hours through mid-June.

KDOT awarded the construction contract of \$3 million to Dustrol Inc., Towanda.
