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## U.S. 400 resurfacing project to start in Greenwood County

Monday, March 6, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) plans to begin a resurfacing project on U.S. 400 in Greenwood County. The road work starts at the east junction of K-99/U.S. 400 and continues east for 15 miles, ending at the Greenwood-Wilson county line.

Project activity includes placement of a 3-inch overlay, centerline rumble strips, shoulders and edge wedge. Flaggers and a pilot car will direct one-lane traffic through the work zone. Expect delays of 15 minutes or less during daylight hours.

KDOT awarded the construction contract of \$12.9 million to APAC-Kansas Inc., Shears Division, of Hutchinson. Weather permitting, the project should be finished by late September.
