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## Signing project begins on area highways

The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) has started a sign replacement project on highways in Greenwood, Woodson, Elk, Butler and Lyon counties. High-performance signs are being installed along sections of U.S. 400, U.S. 54, K-99, K-249 and K-58. Traffic will occasionally be reduced to one lane on K-99 and K-58, with brief delays expected.
