

K-27 Asphalt Replacement in Syracuse Fact Sheet

About the Project

Work to replace almost one mile of asphalt pavement on K-27 from Road 21/Golf Course Road south of Syracuse north to the U.S. junction in Syracuse is scheduled to begin April 1.

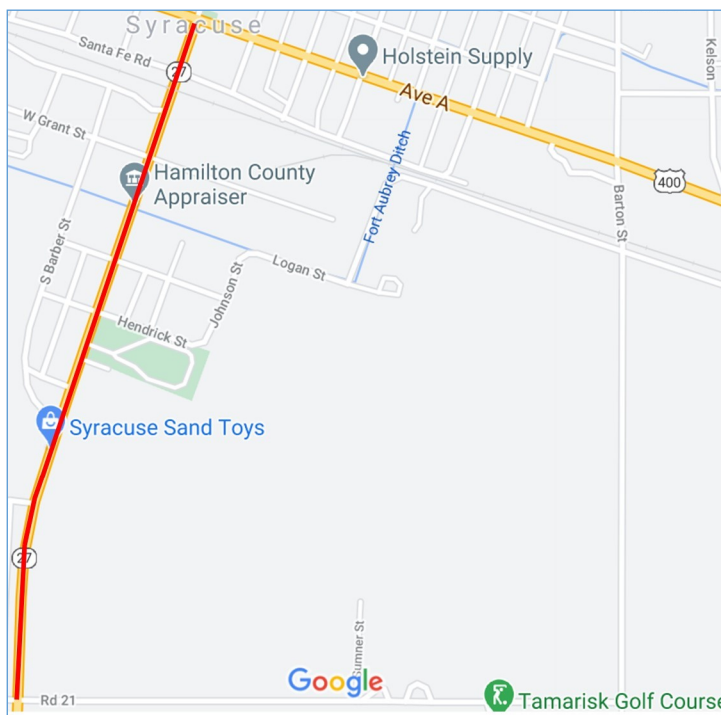
The \$6.5 million project is being completed by Venture Corporation of Great Bend. Work is expected to be finished in October.

Project improvements:

- ◆ Removal and replacement of asphalt on K-27 from south of the Syracuse city limit to the U.S. 50/K-27 junction in Syracuse;
- ◆ Rebuild curbs and gutters along the route;
- ◆ Replace the current storm sewer to allow for better drainage;
- ◆ Install new water lines in area impacted by the project;
- ◆ Improve current shoulders from Road 21/Golf Course Road to the Syracuse city limits.



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Traffic Impacts:

K-27 traffic will be reduced to one lane in both directions from U.S. 50 south to Road 21/Golf Course Road during phase one of the project.

K-27 traffic from Miguel Dairy south to Road 21/Golf Course Road will be reduced to one lane with a temporary traffic signal controlling traffic during phase two and three of the project.
