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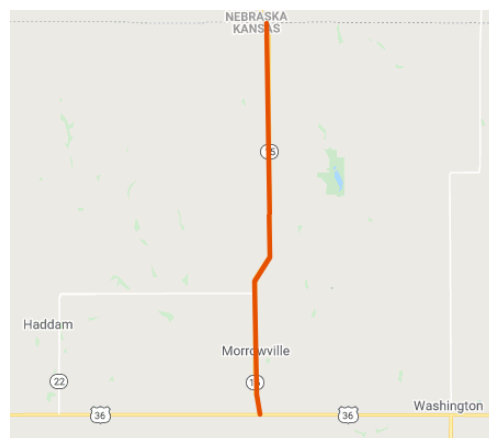
Resurfacing begins on K-15 in Washington County

The Kansas Department of Transportation has begun work for a surface recycle and chip seal project in Washington County. Work on K-15 will extend from the K-15/U.S. 36 junction and continuing north approximately 13 miles to the Nebraska state line.

Drivers should be prepared for a delay of up to 15 minutes and plan extra time in their travel schedules. Traffic will be reduced to one 11-foot lane following a pilot car through the work zone. Construction will take place Monday through Friday with occasional Saturday work during daylight hours.

Bettis Asphalt and Construction Inc. of Topeka is the prime contractor and has scheduled this \$1,083,672 project to be completed in late October, weather permitting.
