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Survey on US-40B in Junction City (Correction)

Surveyors will soon be conducting work on US-40BS (6th St.) in order to gather information necessary for the detailed design of a bridge in Junction City. The survey will take place along a 3000 feet corridor beginning near Franklin St. then east to Filley St. The survey began Monday, Sept. 14th and will be completed by mid-November weather permitting.

A member of the survey crew will first contact property owners and/or tenants for permission prior to entering private property. Survey activities will include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the survey corridor.

Rob Selley, P.S., Field Service Manager, will be in charge of this survey for the Kansas Department of Transportation.

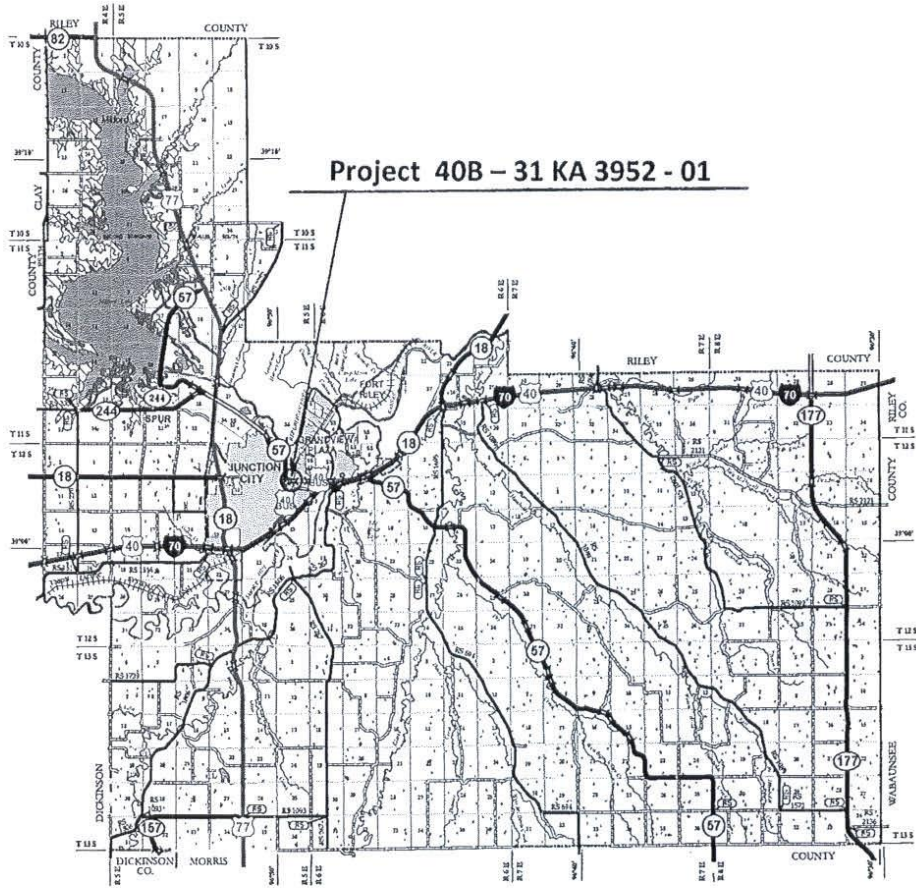
