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Field survey begins on K-34 in Clark County

A field survey begins this week (July 8) on a segment of K-34 in Clark County for a possible highway improvement. The survey crew will gather information that is necessary for the detailed design of the proposed project.

The segment to be surveyed begins four miles north of the K-34/U.S. 160/U.S. 183 junction and continues north four miles. This section of K-34 features a series of curves which would be addressed by the proposed improvements. KDOT currently has funding only for the preliminary engineering on this project and no money has been identified under T-WORKS for construction.

The survey work should last about three months. A member of the survey crew will contact property owners or tenants for permission to enter private property. Survey activities include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine the locations of existing features within the survey corridor.
