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Resurfacing project scheduled for K-237

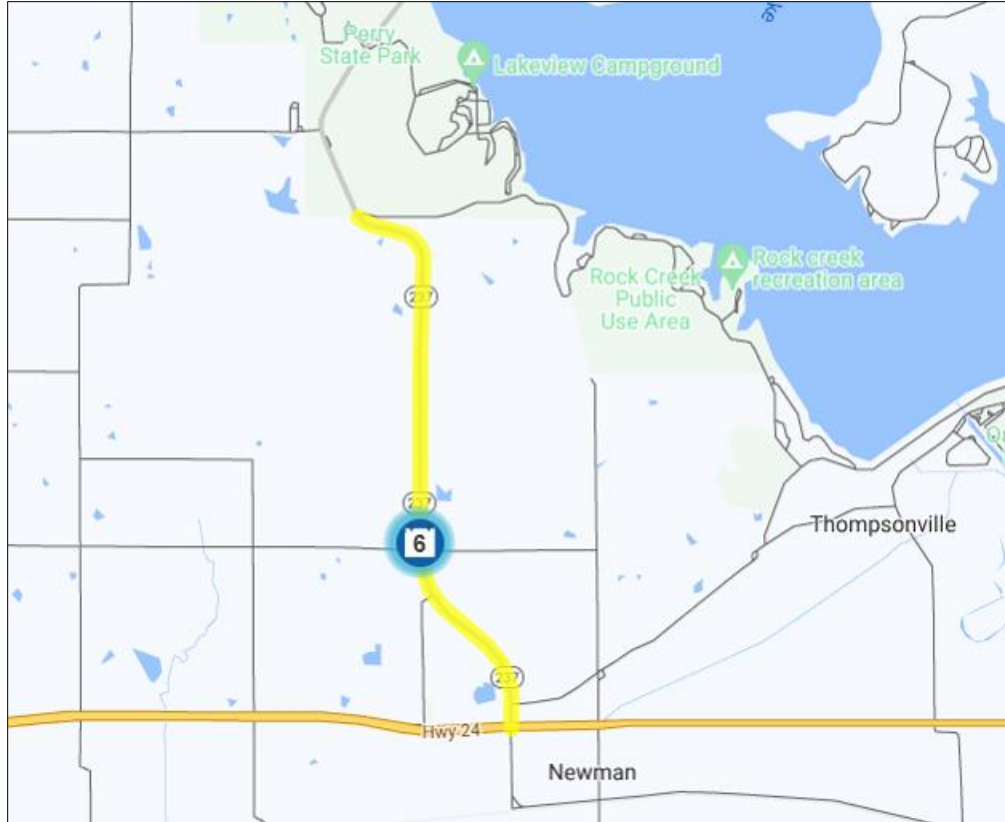
Mill and overlay work is scheduled to begin on K-237 in Jefferson County on Wednesday, Sept. 6, conditions permitting. The Kansas Department of Transportation project covers approximately 4 miles, from U.S. 24 to the end of the route at Perry State Park.

The roadway will be reduced to one lane when work is taking place, and traffic will be directed by a pilot car and flaggers. A 10-foot width restriction will also be in place. Drivers should plan for delays of up to 15 minutes.

Work will occur during daylight hours Monday through Friday, and Saturdays as needed. It is expected to be complete by late November.

Bettis Asphalt & Construction, of Topeka, is the contractor on the \$1 million project.
