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K-4 pavement improvement project begins tomorrow in Wabaunsee County

A Kansas Department of Transportation pavement improvement project on K-4, from K-177 to the west limits of the City of Eskridge, is scheduled to start tomorrow, Tuesday, June 13, in Wabaunsee County, weather permitting.

The project includes milling and overlay on all lanes of K-4, shoulder improvements and pavement marking.

For the duration of the project, while work is taking place, flaggers and a pilot car operation will carry single lane traffic through the work zone, with a 10-foot width restriction. Motorists should expect delays of up to 15 minutes in the project area.

Work will take place during daylight hours Monday through Friday, and Saturday, as needed. Traffic will be controlled using lane closures, signage, traffic cones, flaggers and a pilot car operation.

Shilling Construction, of Manhattan, is the contractor for the \$3.8 million project, which is expected to be completed in mid-August.
