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Guardrail work planned in Shawnee County

A guardrail project is scheduled to begin on Tuesday, April 5, weather permitting, in Shawnee County. Work will occur at seven locations on U.S. 40, U.S. 24 and K-4.

According to the Kansas Department of Transportation, there will be a lane closure where work is taking place. Flaggers will direct traffic when necessary. Advanced signing and cones will mark the work zone.

A box extension is also being completed at Site #2 on U.S. 24 near mile marker 355. Beginning April 22, one-lane traffic at this location will be controlled by a temporary traffic signal for approximately one month. Motorists should expect minor delays.

Bettis Asphalt & Construction, Inc., of Topeka, is the contractor on the \$990,000 project. Work is expected to be complete by late August.
