Westbound I-70 to close this weekend in Topeka

Westbound I-70 through downtown Topeka will be closed this weekend for pavement patching on the Polk-Quincy Viaduct.

Weather permitting, the Kansas Department of Transportation will close **westbound I-70 from 8th Street to Topeka Boulevard at 11 p.m. on Friday, Oct. 13.** The closure will be in place until work is complete, or no later than 11:59 p.m. on Sunday, Oct. 15.

The 8th Street exit will be the last open exit for westbound motorists. Through traffic will follow signed detours and be routed south to I-470, or north to K-4 to U.S. 24 to U.S. 75. Or drivers can use the local street detour: Madison Avenue to 6th Street to Topeka Boulevard to the 1st Street I-70 on-ramp.

Eastbound I-70 traffic will remain open, but still reduced to one lane.

Additional I-70 closures may occur if further patching work is needed on the viaduct. If necessary, KDOT will work with the City of Topeka to schedule the closure and provide information when available.

Both directions of I-70 will stay reduced to one lane until construction of the viaduct's replacement is complete. The Polk-Quincy Viaduct project is scheduled to begin in early 2025. More information about the project can be found at www.polkquincy.org.
