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Field survey starting for U.S. 160 bridge replacement in Winfield

A field survey will begin around Tuesday, March 1, for a proposed bridge replacement on U.S. 160 over the Walnut River in Cowley County.

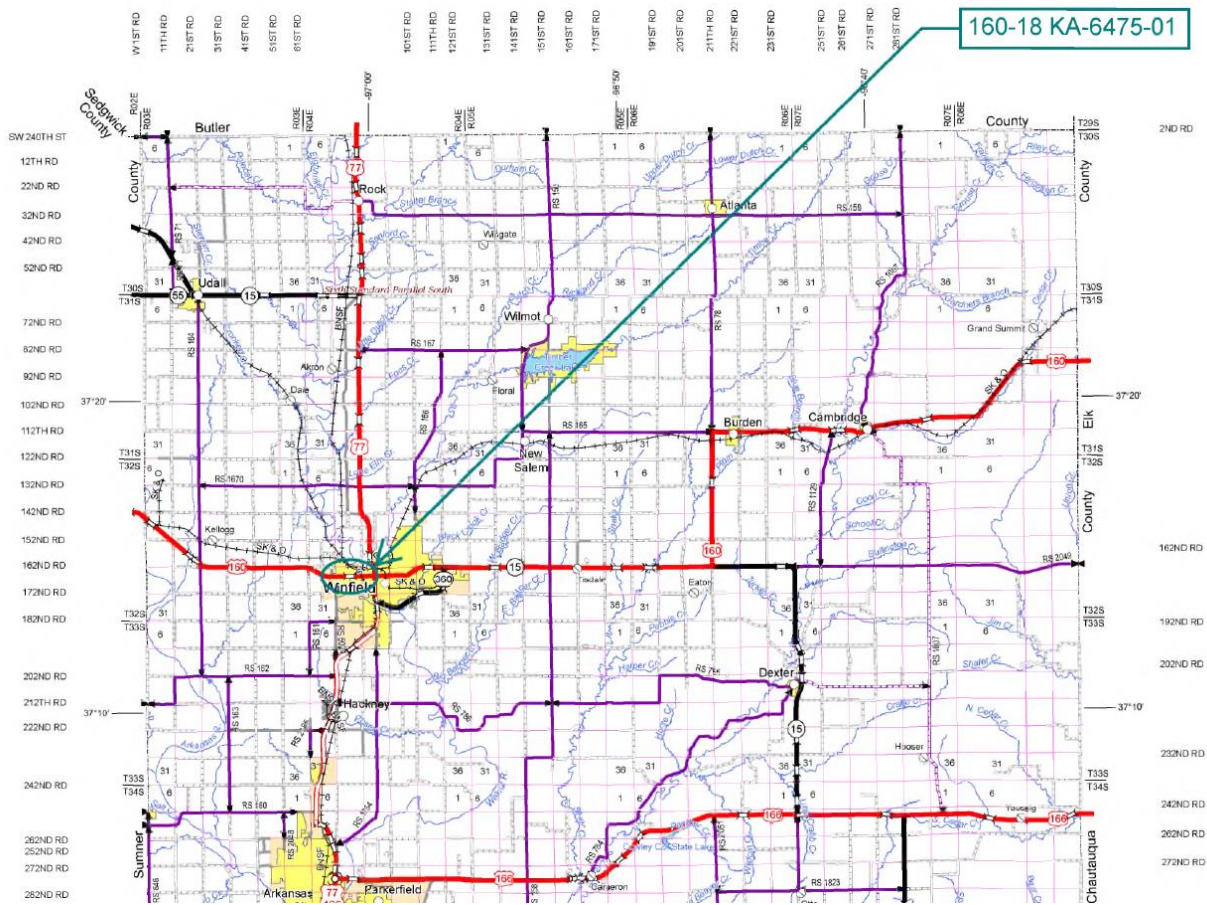
The proposed replacement, by the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT), is 8.3 miles east of the Sumner/Cowley county line. That's on the west side of Winfield. The approximate length of the survey is 3,500 feet, and the survey will be based on the existing alignment.

This field survey effort, to gather information needed for the detailed design of the proposed improvement, is estimated to be completed by May 15.

A member of the survey crew first will contact property owners and/or tenants for permission to enter private property. Survey activities will include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the survey corridor.

Mike Adams, P.S., Survey Project Manager, CFSE, will be in charge of this survey for KDOT.
