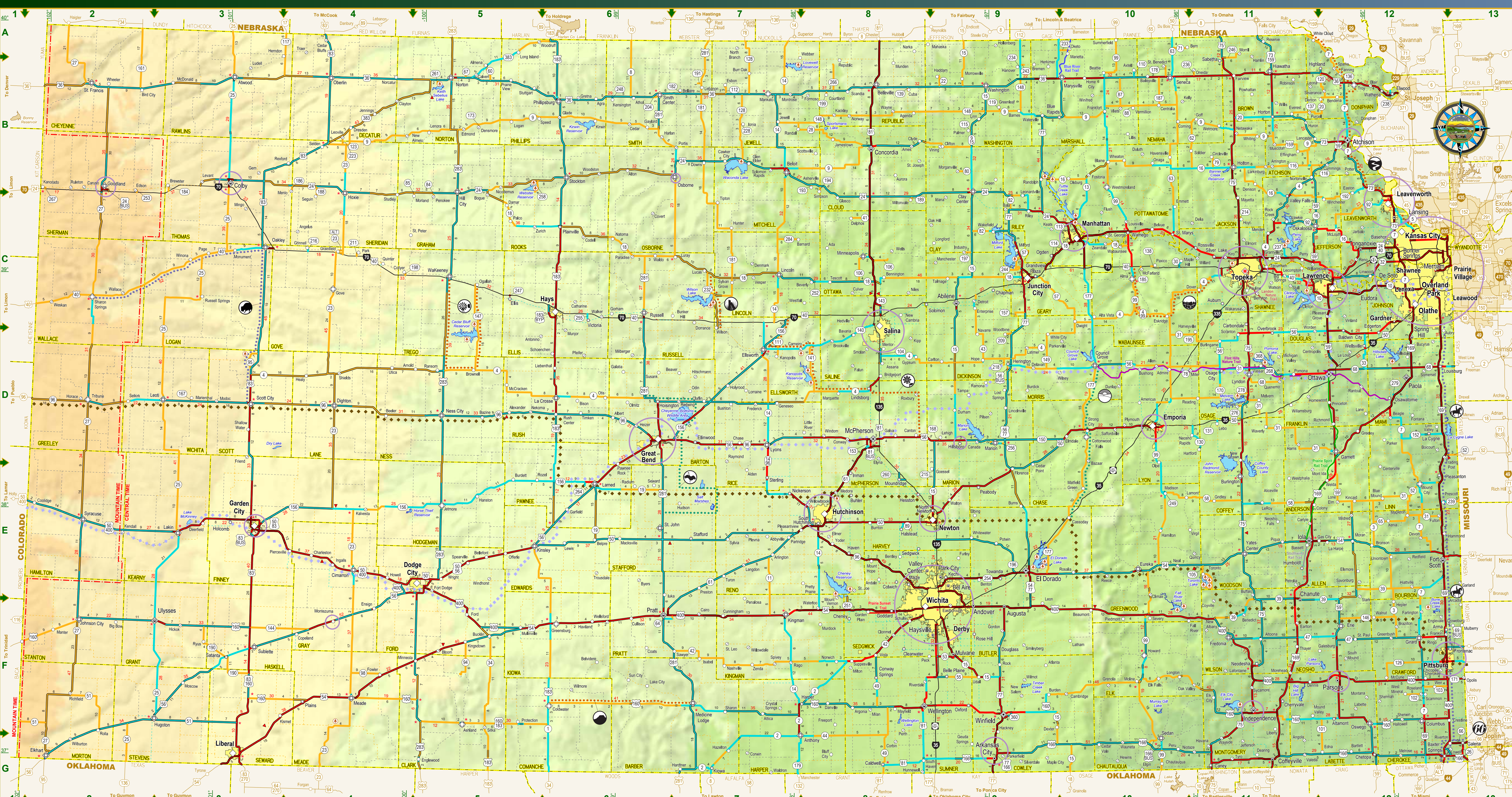

Welcome to Kansas! We at the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) are eager to share with you its abundance of rich heritage, landscape, cultural attractions, and recreational resources. For bicyclists, Kansas is well known for its scenic vistas whose panoramas show the state unfold during their ride. You will find Kansas eager to make your stay a pleasant one! This map was created to help you plan routes based on your own preference and comfort levels by providing information on the Kansas State Highway System and on select county roads. Information on daily traffic volumes and available shoulder widths will help you plan a trip that is most comfortable to you. The map also shows the location of some of Kansas' longer rail trails, the Kansas Byways, national routes that cross Kansas, and helpful resources such as rest areas and cities with bicycle shops. Please note, cyclists using this map assume the risk for their own safety when traveling on routes identified through the use of this map.
