## It's the law!

Child Passenger Safety Act (KSA 8-1343)

- This law requires all children under age 4 to be in a federally approved child safety seat.
- Children ages 4 to 8 must be in a federally approved child safety seat/booster seat

UNLESS the child weighs more than 80 Ibs. OR is taller than 4'9."

- Children 8 years of age but under the age of 14 must be protected by a safety belt
- This law applies to all passenger cars designed for carrying fewer than 10 passengers, as defined by KSA 8-1343a. The fine is $\$ 60$ plus court costs.
- Persons under age 14 are prohibited from riding in any portion of the vehicle not intended for passengers; this includes riding in the back of pickup trucks. The fine for this violation is $\$ 60$ plus court costs.


## Safety Belt Use Act (KSA 8-2501)

- Primary Enforcement: Occupants of a passenger car* 14 years of age but younger than 18 years of age can be cited for this violation-KSA 8-2503. The fine is $\$ 60$, including court costs.
- Front-seat occupants of a passenger car* 18 years and older can be cited for a seat belt violation.

The fine is $\$ 5$, including court costs. Fines after July 1, 2011, will be $\$ 10$, including court costs.

- Slder can be cited for a seat belt violation only after another citation is issued, such as a front-seat primary seat belt violation (KSA 8-2501). The fine is $\$ 5$, including court costs. Fines after July 1 , 2011, will be $\$ 10$, including court costs.


## Commercial Seat Belt DOT. 392.16/ CMV 66-1,129 82-4-3h <br> - A commercial motor vehicle which has a seat belt assembly installed at the driver's seat shall

 not be driven unless the driver has properly restrained himself/herself with the seat belt assembly. Fine: $\$ 100$ plus court cost.
harness fit:
Tighten so only one finger fits under harness at collar bone.

RETAINER CLIP:
Adjust to be level with armpits.
All children 12 and under should ride in the back seat. Lap belt MUST fit across upper thighs and shoulder bet MUST fit across center of chest.

rear-facing seat: Seat must be reclined at proper angle. Check car seat instruction book for angle recommendation. The base of the seat needs to look like it is sitting flat on a table top. Use towel or foam noodle to maintain position.


Check child restraint or vehicle owner's manual for correct usage instructions. TOP TETHER STRAP: Attach strap to auto manufacturer's anchor. Limits upper body forward movement.

*This law applies to all passenger cars carrying fewer than 10 passengers as defined by KSA 8-2502.
