### JOINT TRAINING SEMINAR PROSECUTING ATTORNEYS & LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

The Kansas Highway Patrol Drug and Alcohol Evaluation Unit, in cooperation with the Wichita City Prosecutor's Office, KDOT Bureau of Traffic Safety and the Wichita Police Department, is offering a fourteen (14) hour course for prosecuting attorneys and law enforcement. This year's seminar will focus on challenges in successful prosecution of offenders from sobriety checklanes, accidents, and reconstructed impaired driving events, as well as practical trial skills, and two hours of Ethics. The seminar will be presented **Monday, September 22 and Tuesday, September 23, 2008 at the Cowtown Pavilion, 1871 Sim Park Drive, Wichita, Kansas.** Classes will begin at 8:30 a.m. and end at 4:30 p.m. both days.

The seminar is designed as an interactive presentation to familiarize prosecuting attorneys with methods, techniques, and training that law enforcement officers utilize in detecting and apprehending suspected impaired drivers. Successful detection, apprehension, and prosecution of impaired offenders is a team effort between prosecutors and law enforcement officers.

Class materials furnished to the participants are courtesy of grant funds administered by the Kansas Department of Transportation, Bureau of Traffic Safety. The Kansas Continuing Legal Education Commission approves this training for fourteen (14) credit hours, to include 2 hours of Ethics. Certificates will be awarded upon completion of the training.

### COURSE OBJECTIVES AND OVERVIEW

The program is designed as a fourteen-hour course for City, County, and District Attorneys to aid in the prosecution of impaired offenders. This seminar will reinforce the "team approach" to DUI prosecution between the SFST Trained Officer, the DRE and the Prosecutor. The material presented is intended to familiarize prosecutors with the background and instruction law enforcement officers receive in their DWI Detection and Standardized Field Sobriety Testing training, Drug Recognition Expert training, as well as the prosecutorial issues involved. It will also address critical issues involved in reconstruction of impaired driving events and accidents, to include DRE reconstructions. The seminar will also address legal and prosecutorial issues involved in sobriety checkpoints.

At the conclusion of the course, the prosecutors will have a thorough understanding of the DWI Detection and Apprehension process, as well as recognition of objective evidence of the crime versus subjective evidence. The seminar will also explore the team approach to prosecution, and the issues involved in the prosecution of impaired drivers, to include forensic evidence for reconstructing critical events involved in drug and alcohol impaired driving.
