Passing lane survey to start on U.S. 400

Starting around February 6 and continuing for approximately 12 weeks, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) will conduct a field survey along U.S. 400 in Cherokee County. The surveyors will gather information necessary for a roadway improvement that will add passing lanes on both sides of U.S. 400. The area to be surveyed starts four miles east of the U.S. 400/K-7 junction and continues east for two miles to the U.S. 400/U.S. 69 junction.

The survey is based on the existing highway alignment. Survey activities will include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the survey corridor.

A survey crew member will first contact property owners and/or tenants for permission to enter private property. David Robinson, L.S., with the consultant firm of Professional Engineering Consultants will be in charge of the survey.

The survey is funded under the T-WORKS statewide transportation program approved by the Legislature in 2010. For more information about T-WORKS projects and funding visit the website, www.ksdot.org/tworks.
