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### **U.S. 400 resurfacing project east of Parsons to start this week**

The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) expects on Wednesday, Sept. 9, to begin a resurfacing project on U.S. 400 east of Parsons.

The project includes a mill and overlay on the driving lanes and placing a chip seal on the shoulders.

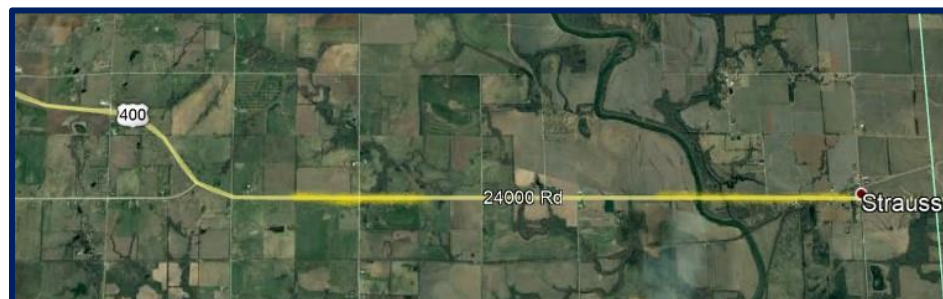
The sections of U.S. 400 to be resurfaced:

- Starting 895 feet east of Trego Road and continuing east for 1,273 feet;
- Starting 1,036 feet east of Victory Road and continuing east for 2.8 miles to York Road.

The contractor plans to start at the west end of the project. Flaggers and a pilot car will direct one-lane traffic through the project area during daylight hours; expect delays of 15 minutes or less. The resurfacing work should be completed in two weeks, weather permitting.

KDOT awarded the \$544,280 construction contract to Heckert Construction of Pittsburg.
