POLICY ON STORM WATER DISCHARGES

It is KDOT's policy to protect water quality and to minimize the impact of storm water discharges from highway construction projects. To achieve these results, KDOT will require the Contractor to develop a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) for each highway construction project administered by KDOT which requires a NPDES permit. It is understood that field adjustments will be made to the SWPPP when necessary.


The SWPPP should include the following items:


- 1) SWPPP Inspection and Maintenance Report Forms
- 2) The Contractor's Erosion Control Site Plan
- 3) SWPPP Contractor Certification Form 246
- 4) A copy of the project Notice of Intent Form (NOI) for Stormwater Runoff from Construction Activities. This can be obtained from KDOT.

The SWPPP should include or reference the following items:

- 1) KDOT's Policy on Storm Water Discharges
- 2) KDOT Standard Specifications and contractual special provisions
- 3) Applicable Standard Plan Sheets

KDOT shall complete the Approval of Contractor's SWPPP Form 219 and file along with the Project SWPPP.
