

Patching FAQ

- 1) What is a patch?
 - a. Patching is one of the terms used to connect resources together that normally are independent of each other. There are several other terms for patching.
- 2) How are resources patched?
 - a. Resources are patched using a Motorola dispatch console (such as a MCC7500) or using a special device in the field (such as an ACU1000).
- 3) Is patching authorized on KSICS?
 - a. Patching on KSICS is not authorized without written permission from KDOT and KHP.
- 4) Can I patch two of my own local talkgroups together?
 - a. All patching on KSICS must have written authorization. We need more information about your circumstances before determining the answer.
- 5) Can I patch my old conventional system to KSICS?
 - a. All patching on KSICS must have written authorization. We need more information about your circumstances before determining the answer.
- 6) Can I use my ACU 1000 (or other special bridging device) to patch resources?
 - a. Please contact us so we can find out more about what you need. We want to make sure there isn't another option.
