
Public Transit



PUBLIC TRANSIT

Kansas receives Federal aid for transit services and related programs through the Federal Transit Administration (FTA). The principal programs of the act provide funding for capital and operation assistance for transport of persons with disabilities, elderly persons and the general public. Additionally, Kansas provides 2.9 million dollars in state funding annually to these public transportation programs.

This program aids states with statewide planning and other technical assistance activities (including supplementing the technical assistance program provided through the Metropolitan Planning Formula Program), planning support for non-urbanized areas, research, development and demonstration projects, fellowships for training in the public transportation field, university research, and human resource development.

This program provides funds to private nonprofit organizations to purchase vehicles and related equipment as well as operating assistance for providing transportation services to meet the special needs of elderly persons and persons with disabilities. Grant recipients may provide service to the general public once the immediate needs of all the elderly persons and persons with disabilities have been met. Coordination of transportation services within each service area is encouraged to make the best use of existing capital resources.

The program provides funding to support non-urbanized area (under 50,000 population) transportation programs that serve the general public. The purpose of the program is to augment existing transportation services and to enhance access to health care, shopping, education, employment, public services, and recreation. Coordination of transportation services with existing providers in each service area is an important part of the program.

RURAL TRANSIT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (RTAP)

Each state receives an annual allocation to develop and implement training and technical assistance programs.
