



**For Northeast Kansas
As of 1:15 p.m. CST
Monday, November 16, 2009**

Current Weather Forecast:

Northeast Kansas, including Topeka Metro Area

This Afternoon: Snow. High near 36. North wind around 15 mph, with gusts as high as 25 mph. Chance of precipitation is 80%. Total daytime snow accumulation of 1 to 3 inches possible.

Tonight: Snow. Low around 32. North wind around 15 mph, with gusts as high as 25 mph. Chance of precipitation is 90%. New snow accumulation of 1 to 2 inches possible.

Tuesday: Rain and snow likely. Cloudy, with a high near 39. North wind between 10 and 15 mph, with gusts as high as 25 mph. Chance of precipitation is 60%. Little or no snow accumulation expected.

Winter Weather Advisory

A Winter Weather Advisory remains in effect until 6 am CST Tuesday, November 17 for the following counties: REPUBLIC-CLOUD-CLAY-JEFFERSON-OTTAWA-DICKINSON-GEARY-MORRIS-WABAUNSEE-SHAWNEE.

Light to moderate snow will gradually spread to the southeast as Temperatures cool to near the freezing mark. Snow will begin to accumulate on grassy surfaces first and could accumulate on roadways as the day progresses Monday. 3 to 6 inches of snow is likely along the US-81 corridor north of Minneapolis...with 2 to 6 inches possible from Dickinson and Morris counties into the Topeka area.

Periods of snow will cause some travel difficulties. Be prepared for snow covered roads and limited visibilities...and use caution while driving.

Greater Kansas City Metro Area

This Afternoon: Occasional rain and snow. High near 36. North wind between 11 and 13 mph. Chance of precipitation is 90%. Total daytime snow accumulation of less than a half inch possible.

Tonight: Rain and snow likely before midnight, then a chance of rain. Cloudy, with a low around 33. North northwest wind around 14 mph, with gusts as high as 20 mph. Chance of precipitation is 60%. New snow accumulation of less than a half inch possible.

Tuesday: Rain likely. Cloudy, with a high near 39. North northwest wind between 11 and 14 mph, with gusts as high as 20 mph. Chance of precipitation is 60%. New rainfall amounts of less than a tenth of an inch possible.

There is no winter weather advisory in effect at this time.

Current Road Conditions

For daytime commutes, drivers should use caution, allow plenty of driving time, and be sure to turn on their headlights, and turn off their cruise control. Drivers should also provide for a safe distance or cushion between themselves and vehicles ahead of them.

We also want to remind drivers to stay a safe distance back from KDOT snow plows, and if they should pass the snow plows, to be extra careful and allow plenty of room as the trucks do travel slower than surrounding traffic.
