

# Westbound K-10 Over Cedar Creek Parkway Bridge Repair Project Begins in Johnson County

On **Wednesday, August 27**, a repair project will begin on the westbound K-10 Bridge over Cedar Creek Parkway in Johnson County. Project work includes deck patching, curb repair and concrete overlay on the bridge deck. Work will take place daily, Monday through Friday during daylight hours.

Beginning on **Wednesday, August 27**, crews will begin setting traffic control for the project. Once the traffic control is in place, sometime later that day, westbound K-10 will be

reduced to one lane from east of the bridge to west of the bridge for approximately .5-miles either side, 24/7 round the clock, throughout the project duration. (See map above.)

Traffic will be directed through the project work zone via concrete safety barrier and signage. There will be a 12-foot lane width restriction and a 60 mph speed limit will be posted through the project work zone.

Advance message boards will alert traffic to the lane closures. Drivers should expect delays, especially during peak morning/evening rush hours, and are encouraged to use alternate routes, if possible.

The Kansas Department of Transportation urges all motorists to be alert, obey the warning signs, and "Give 'Em a Brake!" when approaching and driving through the project work zone.

Comanche Construction Company (Shawnee Mission, KS) is the primary contractor on this bridge repair project with a total contract cost of \$133,070. **The scheduled completion date for the project is late October 2014, weather permitting.**
