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I-35 pavement improvement project begins tonight in Johnson County

A Kansas Department of Transportation pavement improvement project on I-35 is scheduled to begin tonight, Monday, April 10, in Johnson County, weather permitting.

The project will include milling and overlay, concrete pavement patching and pavement marking on northbound and southbound I-35 lanes and ramps, from Lamar Avenue to the Kansas-Missouri state line.

Nightly lane closures are scheduled on northbound and southbound I-35, between Lamar Avenue and the Kansas-Missouri state line, from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m., where work is taking place.

The following I-35 entrance and exit ramps will be closed as needed: Lamar Avenue, Roe Boulevard, Southwest Boulevard, Mission Road, 7th Street Trafficway and Cambridge Drive.

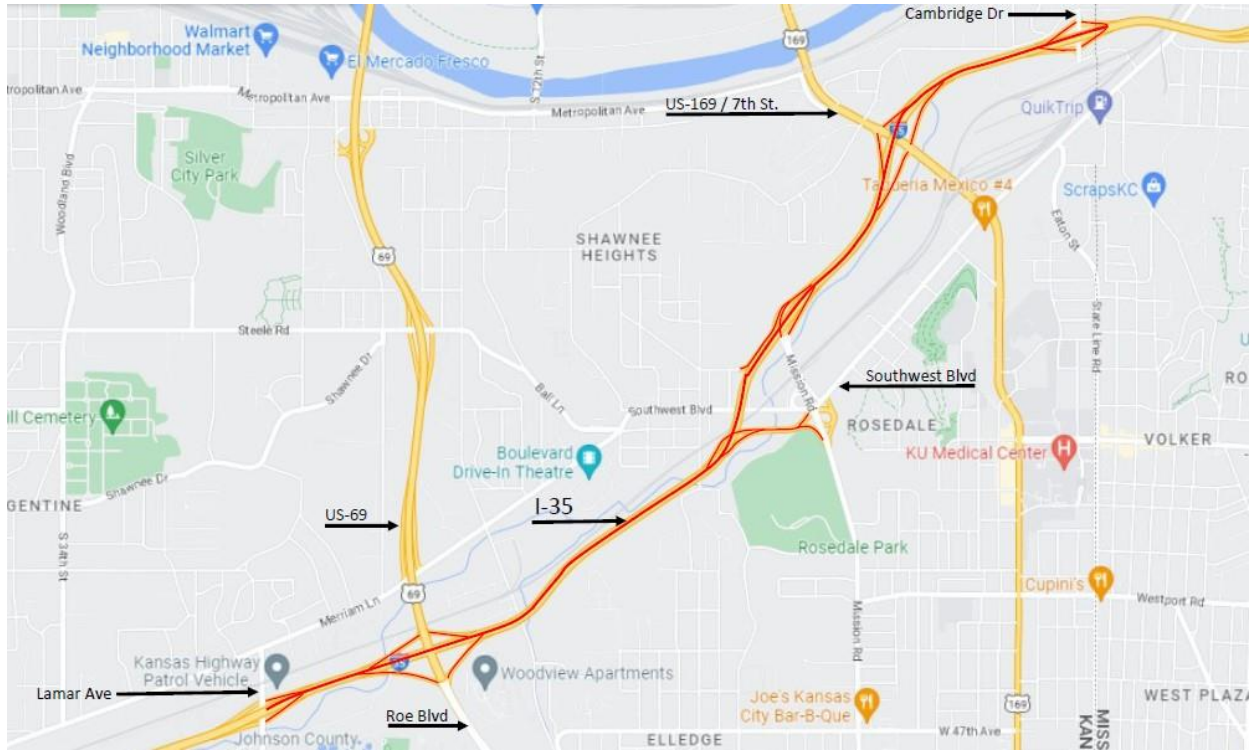
Message boards are in place notifying motorists of the upcoming project.

Traffic will be controlled using lane, portable message signs, arrow boards, signage and traffic cones.

Superior Bowen, of Kansas City, Mo., is the contractor for the \$10.8 million project, which is expected to be completed in mid-June.
